23. 100-word abstract of project
24. Proposal: Attach a proposal not exceeding four double-spaced pages explaining what you intend to study during the two-month residency, the significance of the project, how resources available at the UW-Madison will aid your research, and a specific plan of work. Provide a brief summary of progress already made on the project. Clearly state the intended product of your research and how the work relates to your future professional development.
