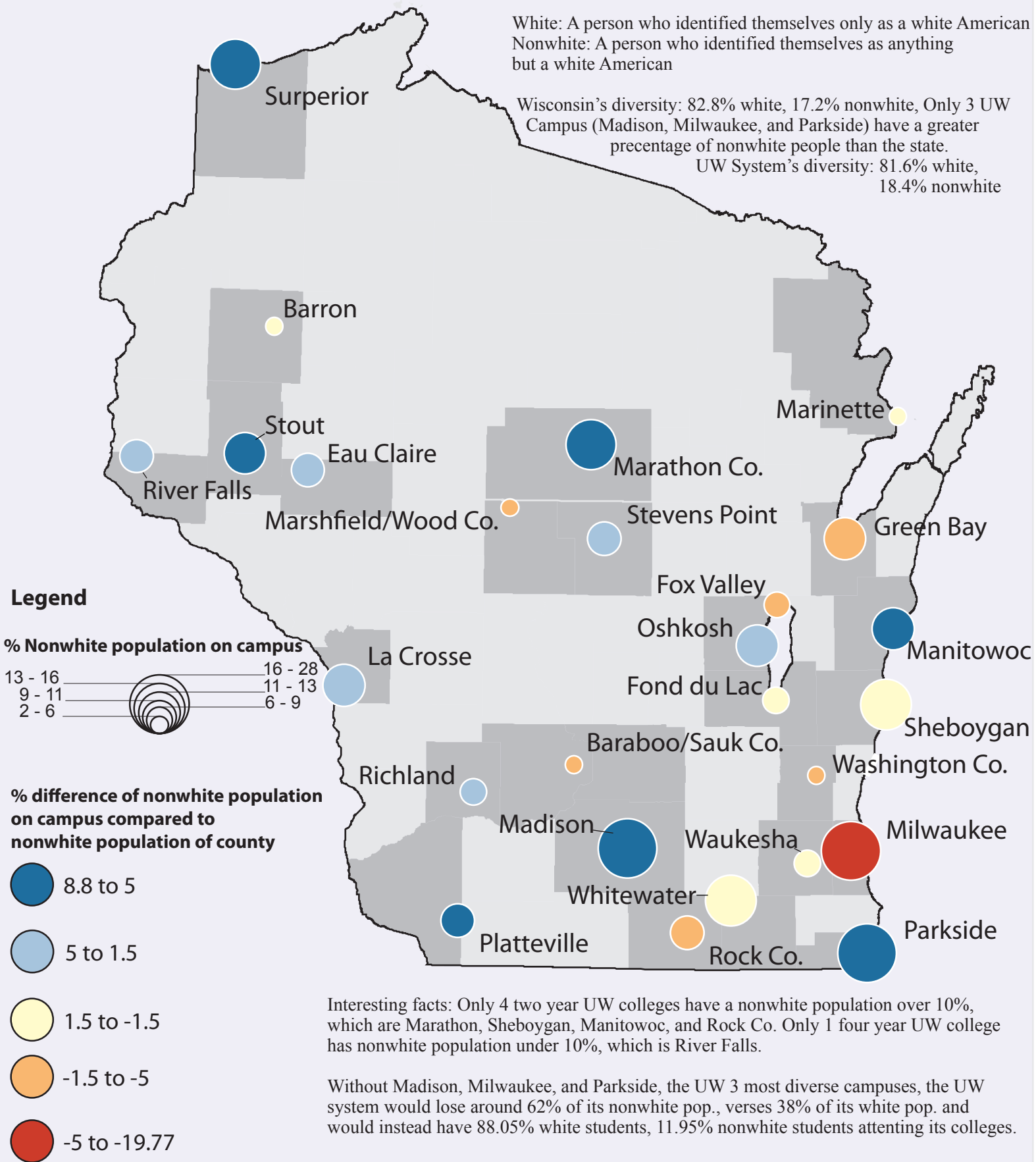


# Diversity and the UW: Are the Campuses too White?

How is white and nonwhite defined for this map?

White: A person who identified themselves only as a white American  
 Nonwhite: A person who identified themselves as anything but a white American

Wisconsin's diversity: 82.8% white, 17.2% nonwhite, Only 3 UW Campus (Madison, Milwaukee, and Parkside) have a greater percentage of nonwhite people than the state.  
 UW System's diversity: 81.6% white, 18.4% nonwhite



Interesting facts: Only 4 two year UW colleges have a nonwhite population over 10%, which are Marathon, Sheboygan, Manitowoc, and Rock Co. Only 1 four year UW college has nonwhite population under 10%, which is River Falls.

Without Madison, Milwaukee, and Parkside, the UW 3 most diverse campuses, the UW system would lose around 62% of its nonwhite pop., versus 38% of its white pop. and would instead have 88.05% white students, 11.95% nonwhite students attending its colleges.
