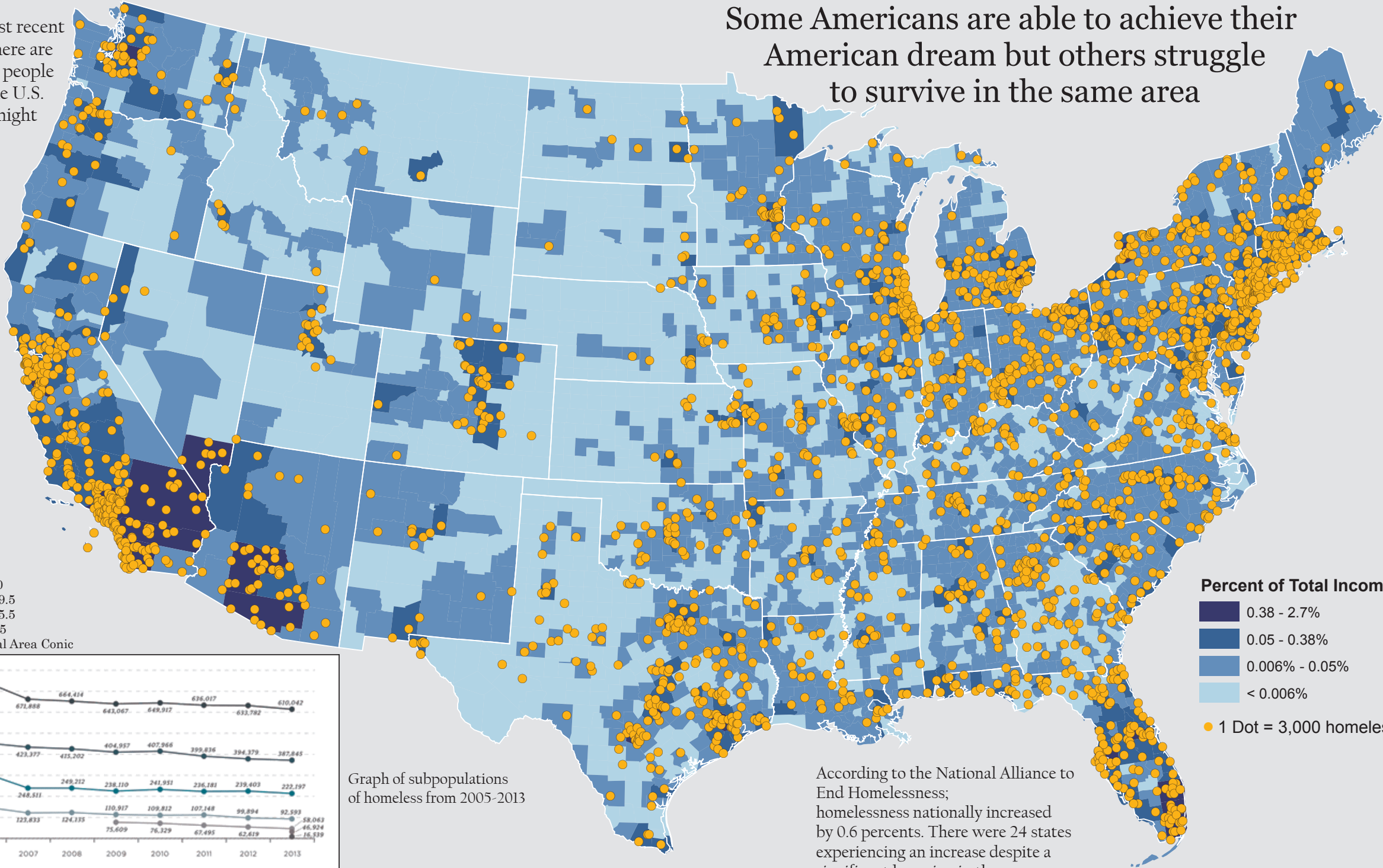


Based on the most recent official count there are around 564,708 people homeless in the U.S. on any given night

Some Americans are able to achieve their American dream but others struggle to survive in the same area

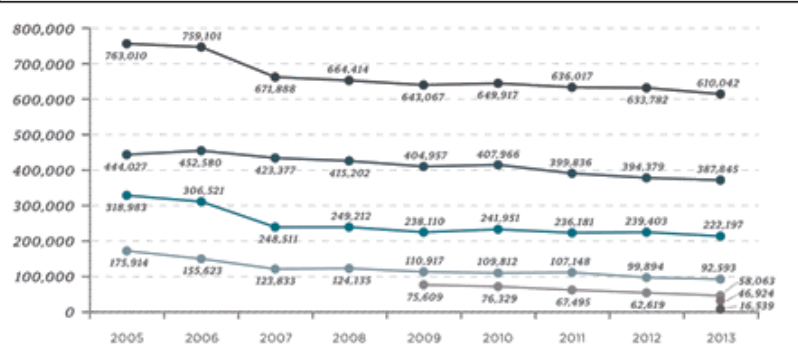
