

# Chicago Crime Varies over Space

Not everyone experiences crime equally.

Violent crime and property crime each have a distinct geography. While property crime is widespread throughout the city, especially in heavily populated areas like downtown, violent crimes occur in smaller clusters, primarily on the city's south and west side.

- **Violent Crimes** (*Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault*)

- **Property Crimes** (*Burglary, Larceny, Theft, Arson, Vandalism, and Trespassing*)

## And by Time of Day

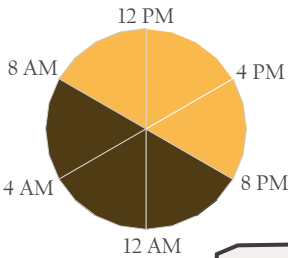
Crime spikes during the daytime.

This pattern is exaggerated on the near northside and downtown, high-density areas with high property crime. On the south and west side - more violent areas - crime occurs more evenly throughout day and night.

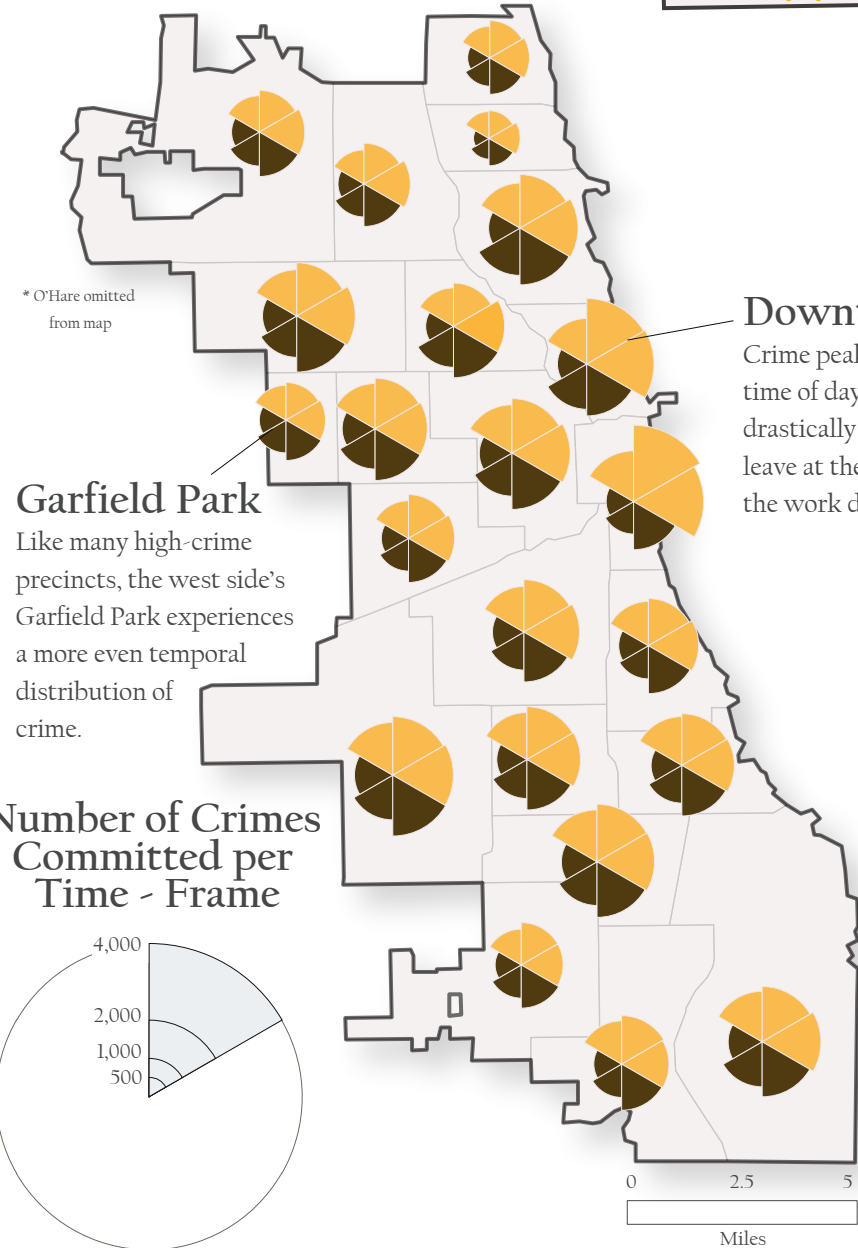

### Garfield Park

Like many high-crime precincts, the west side's Garfield Park experiences a more even temporal distribution of crime.

### Downtown

Crime peaks at the busiest time of day, but fades drastically when people leave at the end of the work day.

## Crimes concentrate around major thoroughfares

For example, crimes cluster around Halsted Street, a major north-south street.

## Downtown is a magnet for property crimes.

Bustling downtown has the largest concentration of property crimes. A large ambient population during the day means a greater chance of offenders and victims being in the same place at the same time.
