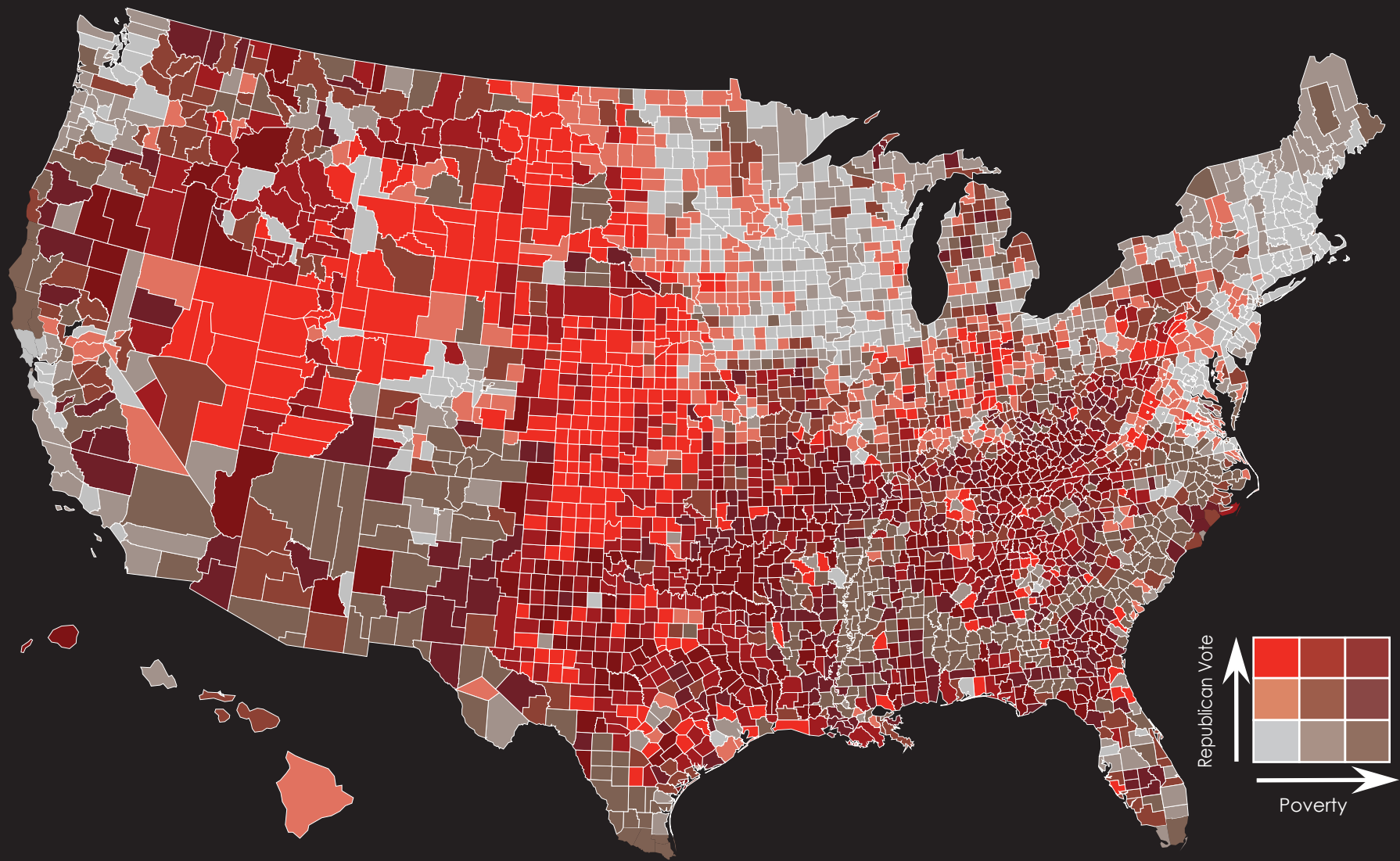
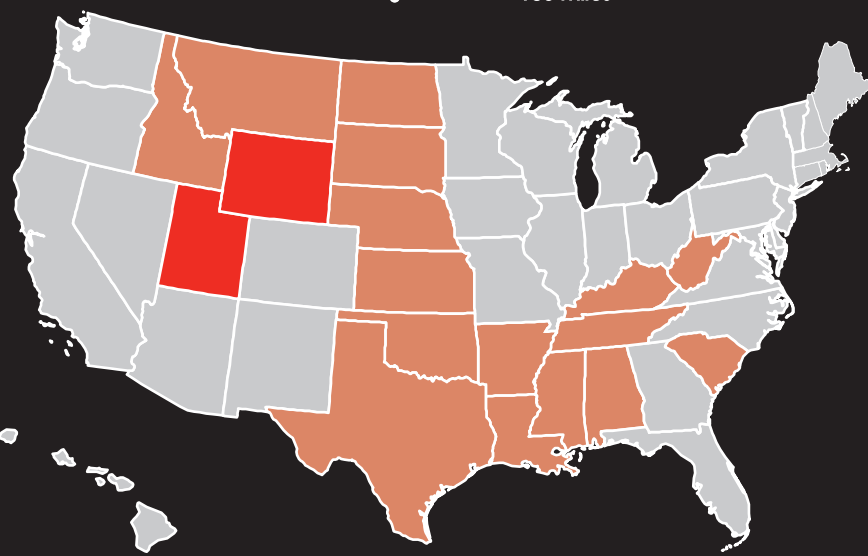
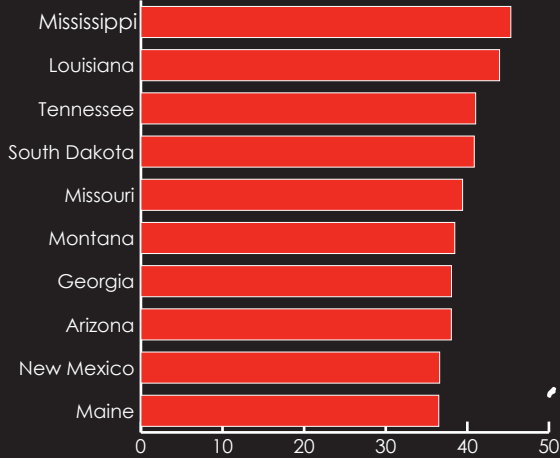


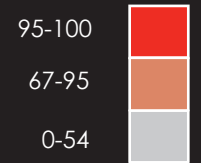

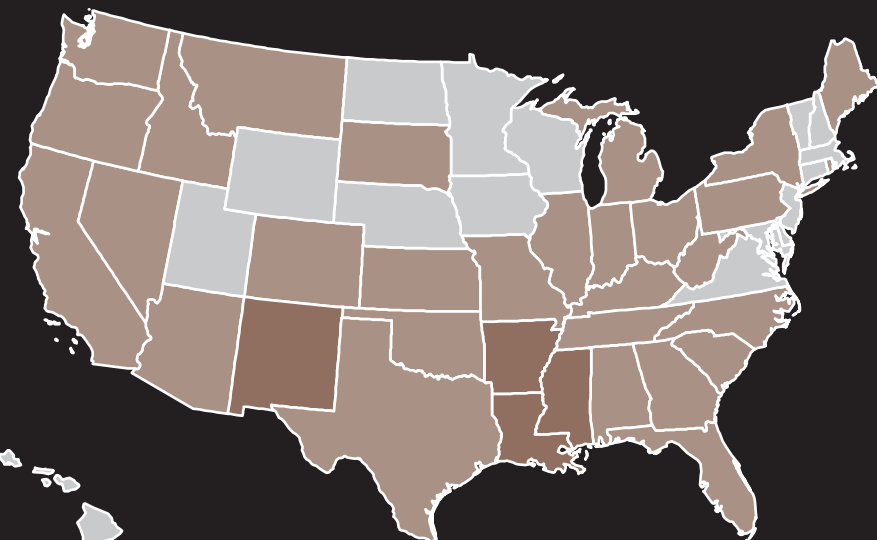
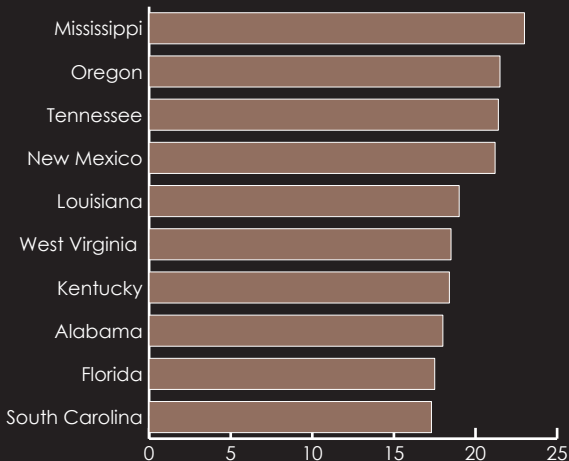
% General Revenue From Federal Government (Top Ten States)



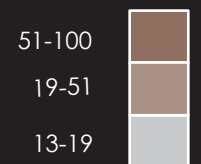
Percent Republican Vote (2012 Election)
