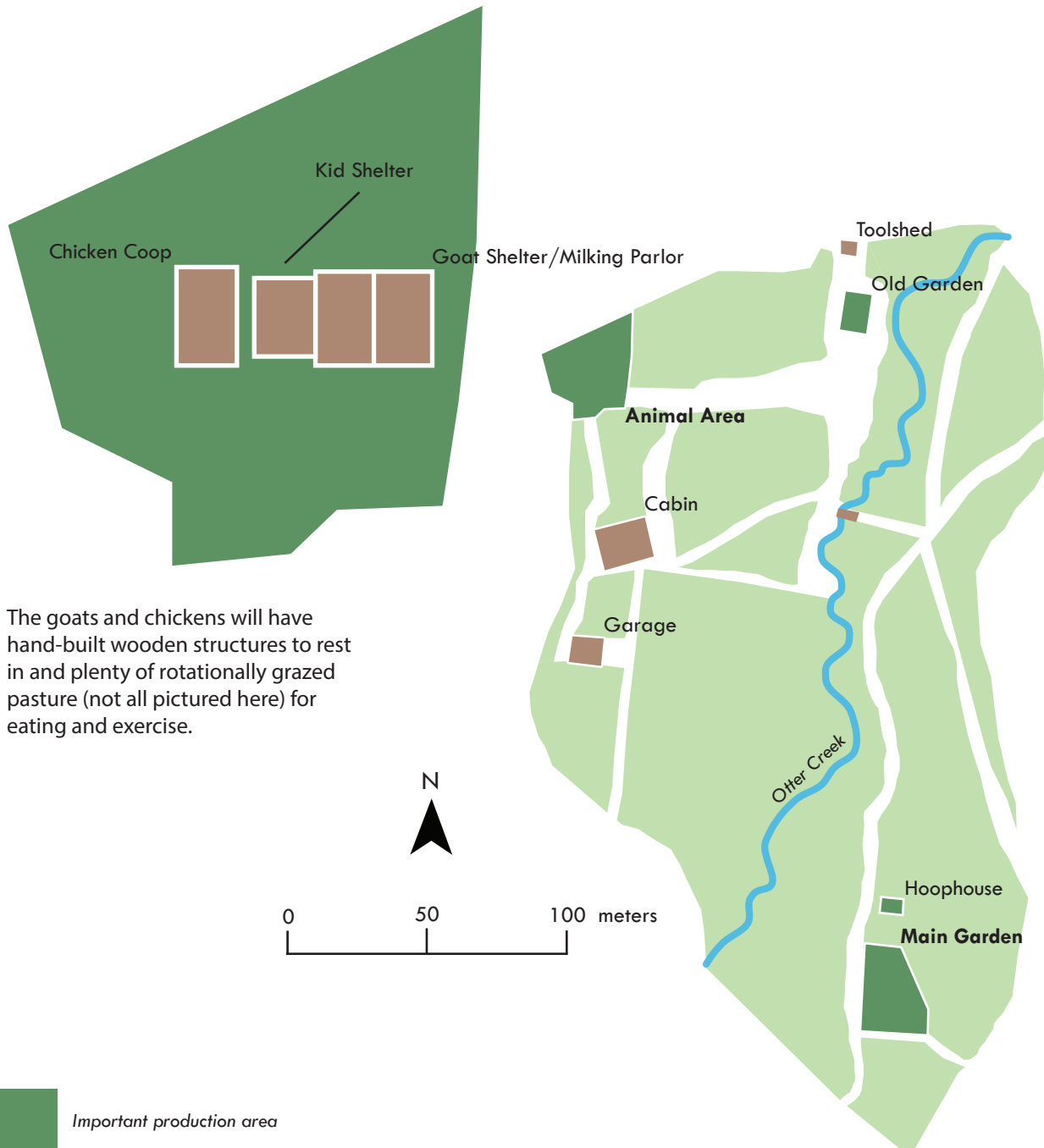




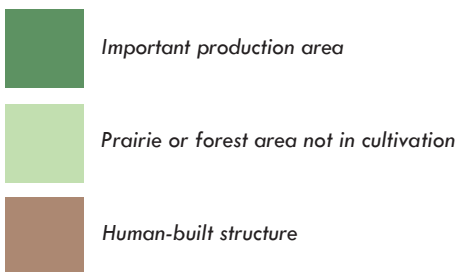
NOMAD FARM

Nomad Farm began as a dream in October of 2015. After a while, the eleven friends that now comprise the team at Nomad decided to make their collective dream a reality. Nestled between towering sandstone cliffs and leaning pines, Nomad Farm produces a wide variety of vegetables for CSA shares, markets and restaurants. The farmers at Nomad also work with goats and chickens for milk and eggs, the latter of which make their way into CSA shares and to market. The Nomad farmers believe that food production is central to the vitality of rural and urban communities, and they strive to take part in this production in sustainable ways. This is a map of the farm: the center is an overview while the corners represent the main areas of production.



The goats and chickens will have hand-built wooden structures to rest in and plenty of rotationally grazed pasture (not all pictured here) for eating and exercise.



The crops at Nomad are grown without the use of any synthetic inputs, using instead methods such as mulching, composting, and intensive weeding. There is also plenty of space for flowers and other perennials to support native pollinator populations.
