

Teen Births and Women's Health Access in Rural Wyoming A snapshot of the U.S.'s least populated state and its battle against teen pregnancy







in the state at 68.6 births per 1,000 girls aged 15-19. It is the second largest in square footage (9183 ft squared, about the size of the state of Vermont), and yet has only one healthcare center that provides Women's Health services. Wind River Indian Reservation constitutes about one third of the county, though the medical clinic with women's health services is not located within the borders of the reservation.
