Mont-Saint-Michel - France Set upon a rocky tidal island about two-thirds of a mile off the coast in Normandy, Mont-Saint-Michel is a Gothic-style abbey built between the 11th - 16th centuries. Mostar - Bosnia and Herzegovina The small historic village of Old Mostar is a photographer and nature lover's dream. Alhambra Palace - Spain A palace, castle, fortress, summer retreat and enclosed town all in one enchanting place, they're set atop two adjacent hills, forming the medieval part of Granada. 8. Diocletian's Palace - Croatia Filled with Roman, Gothic and Renaissance architecture. It resembles a large citadel and was used by the emperor personally and as a military garrison.
