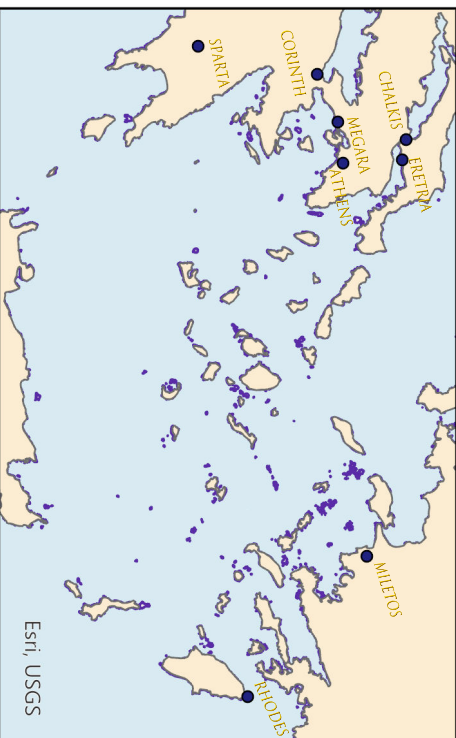
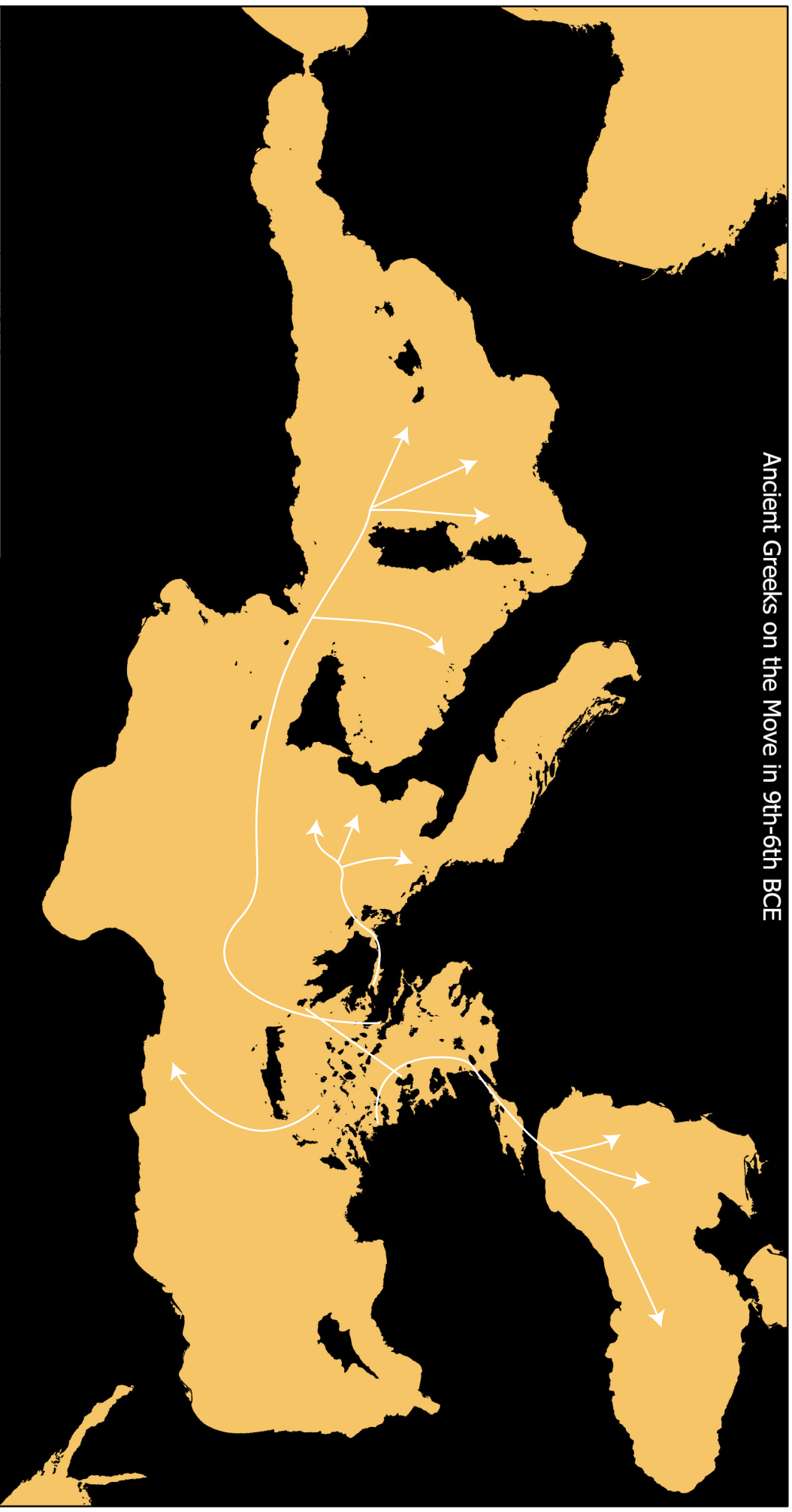


Ancient Greeks on the Move in 9th-6th BCE
