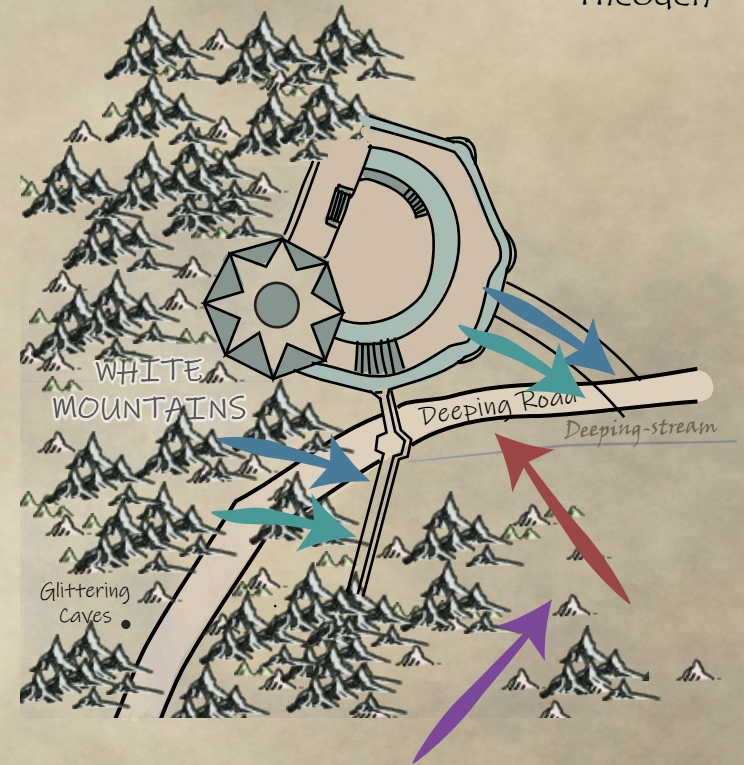


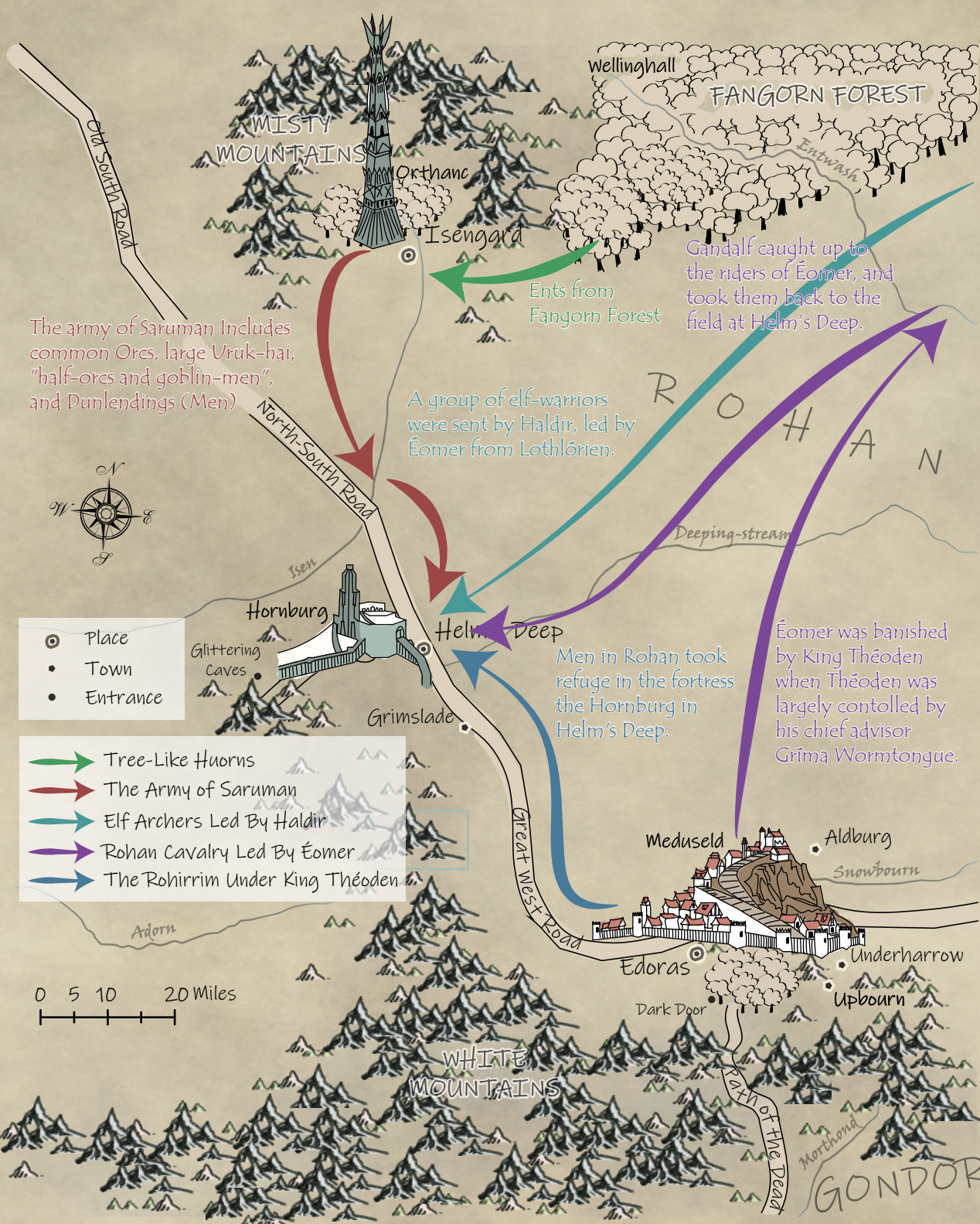
# The Battle of Helm's Deep

The Battle of Helm's Deep, also known as the Hornburg, marked the first major conflict of the War of the Ring. Led by King Théoden, the Rohirrim defended against Saruman's army of Dunlendings and Uruk-hai. This map illustrates the origins of various forces in the battle, based on adaptations from The Lord of the Rings movies rather than the book series.

Gandalf caught up to the riders of Éomer, and took them back to the field at Helm's Deep.

Men in Rohan took refuge in the fortress the Hornburg in Helm's Deep.

Éomer was banished by King Théoden when Théoden was largely controlled by his chief advisor Gríma Wormtongue.
