## POPE FARM CONSERVANCE **About the Conservancy** Located in Middleton Wisconsin, the Pope Farm Conservancy is a 105 acre plot that contains seven rotating crop fields in addition to several Wisconsin wildlife habitats including oak savanna and natural prairie. The project to form the conservancy started in 2000 with the goals of preventing future development to preserve the land as a working farm and educational opportunity for the community as well as protecting natural landscapes and wildlife. The conservancy opened in 2006 after being unanimously approved by town officials in late 2004.
